A Year of Change and Challenge

It is hard to believe that my first year as President of the MCA is coming to a close. What a year it has been!

We formed several new committees to help get the strategic plan, which was approved in 2016, put into action. What have those committees achieved so far?

- The volunteer committee led by **Bruce Ferretti** was formed to encourage more Meadows residents to get actively involved in our community. As a result of this effort, more than 60 new volunteers signed up for their choice of committees and have been helping with specific projects.
- A new activities committee, at first chaired by **Bob Clark** and now chaired by **Marilyn Maleckas**, is key to planning for the proposed amenities center and is responsible for some of the programs that are bringing new life into our community.
- Marilyn Maleckas also heads the new community involvement team, which coordinated The Meadows' participation in the 2017 World Rowing Championships at Benderson Park last September.
- To help focus our communications in the community, we formed a new communications team to work with our staff. Together, they have done a great job of creating and sharing a series of articles that highlight individuals and associations in The Meadows who are enthusiastically engaging in the Renaissance Plan by improving their homes. The communications committee also suggested expanding our electronic messaging and developed a policy to guide our digital media communications.
- We renamed the restrictions committee, now standards, to emphasize the work this team does in setting standards for our community's appearance. Under the guidance of Bob Clark, the standards committee recognizes individuals who improve and maintain their properties, and it assures that all residents abide by the rules and standards of The Meadows.
- The new personnel committee under my direction has developed new staff performance review policies and reviewed many of our personnel and salary policies.

It was fortuitous that we had this infrastructure in place when the country club management approached us in August. They reported that the proposed deal to sell the rezoned land adjacent to the clubhouse and plans to construct 180 units there had collapsed. They said they were considering a new deal with the same developer that would include the sale of all the assets of the club and involve as many as 520 additional units.

We agreed to work with the club and the developers and to approve the use of the units, contingent upon their agreeing to work within all our covenants and agreeing that nothing would be constructed without our approval. They also agreed to give us \$1 million for a new activities center for the community.

We already had our strategic plan in place and our work teams ready when the club and the MCA agreed that this new agreement was not quite right. We had built a solid working relationship with the club and were able to quickly take the direction we got from the community to protect our green space.

The executive committees of the club and the MCA meet regularly to develop a vision for the future that secures the finances of the club while protecting the finances of the MCA. This future vision includes offering new and upgraded amenities and activities to both club members and residents, and it includes enhancing the appearance of the entire Meadows property. It has all become a part of our Renaissance Plan, the master plan for our unique community that builds on all

our resources, including The Meadows Country Club, Aviva—Campus for Senior Living, The Meadows Shopping Village and Tarpon Point Nursing and Rehabilitation.

While we are hard at work on developing the Plan, the Renaissance is already happening. Individual home owners and condo associations are revitalizing their landscaping. Several associations have installed new lighting or are in the process of doing so. Pavers are replacing asphalt drives and trucks transporting staff and materials of roofers, painters and renovation teams can be seen on nearly every block. Aviva hosted several events at the MCA, and the MCA has conducted programs at Aviva and the country club, to which all residents were invited.

You can feel the excitement in the air. More residents are joining in and enjoying community events, and we are creating new events. We have made a beginning and are positioned to move ahead in 2018. The Meadows is a wonderful place to live, and with the support and participation of more and more community members, it just keeps getting better.

Incidents up in January 2018 from December 2017

During the month of January, there were 74 reported incidents, 19 more than in December 2017. There were 3 incident-free days. The Safety Patrol issued 176 citations for various violations such as illegally parked vehicles, garbage violations, and open garage doors.

Petit Theft—the Grinch, still roaming the neighborhood

On January 2, a resident of Greenbelt Yard reported that sometime between December 19 and 20, person(s) unknown removed several Christmas ornaments from the Meadowlake Association sign on Glebe Farm Road near Meadowlake Court. A four-foot lighted reindeer and a four-foot, lighted sleigh containing three lighted gift boxes were taken. The value of the items was estimated at \$75.

Auto burglars on one-day binge "break-ins" of unlocked vehicles

On January 24 at 3:31 am, a newspaper delivery person reported an unknown subject going through cars in the 5300 block of Myrtlewood in Somerset. The subject(s) then left the area in an unknown vehicle. Meadows Safety Patrol and the Sarasota County Sheriff's Office responded and discovered four unlocked vehicles had been entered and rummaged through.

On January 24 at 10:14 am, three separate residents from the 5300 block of Myrtlewood in Somerset reported that person(s) unknown entered their unlocked vehicles and rummaged through the interior.

Petit theft—delivered package removed from door step

On January 29, a resident of Willow Green reported that person(s) unknown removed a package from the front doorstep that was confirmed as delivered on Saturday, January 27 at 12:44 pm.

Unlocked car doors still a big target in The Meadows despite all warnings

You can see from these brief incident reports The Meadows had seven car break-ins in one night in the Myrtlewood section. Just two months ago, there were nine car break-ins in the Glebe Farm Road

area.

Despite all the warnings given throughout the year about leaving vehicles unlocked overnight, it appears that many of our residents are not paying attention. These seven vehicles broken into in the Somerset section of Myrtlewood were all targeted because the car doors were unlocked.

Thieves like these come into communities like ours overnight and start trying car doors to see which ones open—and apparently they are having great success doing it. They don't want to break glass or make other noise to gain access into these vehicles. If the car door they try is locked, they just move on to the next one.

It's possible these are the same individuals, and they know they have easy targets in The Meadows.

Don't let your vehicle be broken into by these thieves. Just take the opportunity away and lock your car doors overnight!



Be proactive!

The Sarasota Sheriff's Office asks the Safety Committee to remind Meadows residents that crimes like these can be prevented if citizens take a proactive approach to protecting their valuables.

Follow these top five commonsense tips to prevent vehicle burglaries:

- 1) **Keep windows closed and doors locked.** The majority of local vehicle burglaries involve unlocked cars, and these crimes wouldn't occur if car doors didn't open.
- 2) *Hide your valuables*. Stash your items out of sight, preferably in a locked trunk. Even criminals know to check the glove box, under a towel, or beneath the seat.
- 3) *Install a retractable cover to hide your valuables.* If you have an SUV or another model with an open cargo area, install a retractable, fitted cover to keep items safely hidden.
- 4) Stow your items before you park. Experienced thieves stake out parking lots and watch for people who put items in their trunks.
- 5) *Trust your instincts*. Avoid parking in unlit or overly concealed areas. If you see a suspicious person,

Meadows Safety Patrol's legal authority...

Sometimes at the Safety Committee meetings, we get questions about what The Meadows uniformed Safety Patrol can and can't do as far as legal authority goes. *Can they write summonses for speeding?* And, *Can they make an arrest?* And so on.

Well, the answer to those two questions is "no." Meadows safety guards are not state-certified law enforcement officers.

Police officers and security guards share a major common purpose—to protect the public and/or its property

However, there are differences between the two occupations.

The basic role of security guards is to protect the property and people of the community that employs them.

Public police officers are sworn to protect all people and property, and they are authorized to enforce the laws of the city and county where they are employed.

While security guards do have the power to apprehend and detain non-violent suspects, only police officers can serve arrest warrants and make legal arrests.

So, fundamentally, the job duties and responsibilities of security guards are not the same as those of peace officers or police officers.

Security guards are in the prevention business

It is their job to act as deterrents to crime, to watch for impending danger, and to report crimes they may encounter.

Recently, a resident questioned the need for a Safety Patrol here in our community. "If all they do is write tickets for garbage violations, who needs 'em?" Well, most of us who have lived here for any length of time know that the Safety Patrol does a lot more than write tickets for garbage violations. They handle a multitude of incidents on a daily basis. Some routine, some not so routine.

Last year, the Safety Patrol handled 440 incidents. There are 40 or so different categories of incidents ranging from animal complaints to home burglaries and everything in between. They are usually the first responders to any



event here and can quickly ascertain if additional emergency response is needed from the Sheriff's Office or Sarasota Fire Department.

The Meadows Safety Patrol officers are an added measure of security for us in The Meadows

They give our residents peace of mind and they look out for you. They are on patrol 24/7 and are a major deterrent to the criminal element; they're not just driving past your house or condo to wave as they go by. What you might not see during their patrol is when they observe a car or person who is out of place or something else that doesn't seem quite right; they investigate to find out why that person or vehicle is in The Meadows. They do everything in their limited power to discourage individuals or vehicles that don't belong here. And they often get verbal abuse and physical threats in the process.

I've noticed from their reports there is an increase in suspicious activity of non-resident individuals and vehicles wandering around. When a Safety officer questions an individual who doesn't belong here or follows a suspicious vehicle, they deter potential criminal activity.

If you think that something or someone doesn't belong here, call Safety and express your suspicions. They will check it out for you. And, if you are not sure if you should call the Sheriff's Office about a particular incident, call Safety; they'll know what to do.

Tax season is officially here, which also means—tax fraud season

It's a time when tens of millions of people become more susceptible to having their personal information stolen and being scammed out of money. The risk may be even bigger this year since just months ago, we saw one of the largest data breaches ever of personal information—the Equifax hack. That is exactly the kind of data that criminals use to commit tax refund fraud and other kinds of tax scams—the most common, when someone files for a refund in your name.

And if they don't already have your personal information, criminals often try to get it through email or phone scams, pretending to be the IRS. For example, they may tell you to access their website to get a refund or tell you you're being fined or are under investigation. If you should get such a call, don't believe it.

The IRS has warned taxpayers about such scams for years.



And if you get a phone call from someone claiming to be an IRS agent, just hang up

From October 2013 to January 2017, more than 10,000 victims collectively paid over \$54 million as a result of phone scams. Don't be fooled by surprise phone calls by criminals impersonating IRS agents with threats or promises of a big refund if you provide them with your private information.

Let's put it this way, if you're really surprised to get a call from the IRS, it almost certainly isn't really the IRS. The IRS always initially contacts taxpayers by mail.

The IRS also combats fraud by delaying refunds for certain types of claims

Besides warning taxpayers about scams, the IRS also tries to combat fraud by delaying refunds for people who claim the Earned Income Tax Credit or the Additional Child Tax Credit, says Nathan Rigney, a tax research analyst at the Tax Institute at H&R Block. "Because those credits are target-rich for tax identity thieves,

this allows the IRS to match the information on those returns to W-2s," he explains.

According to the IRS, the earliest those refunds will be issued this year is mid-February. "The IRS expects the earliest Earned Income Tax Credit or the Additional Child tax credit-related refunds to be available in taxpayer bank accounts or on debit cards starting on February 27, 2018, if they chose direct deposit and there were no other issues with the tax return," the agency said earlier this month.



Grandparents Scam—it's still here

I have written about this scam often in *The Meadoword*. And when I do, it's because someone in this community reported that it actually happened to them.

Last month, another of our residents, who is a grandfather, received a phone call from a scammer pretending to be his grandson. The con artist said he crashed his car on the way to the airport and was in jail. He then said he had a lawyer but needed \$12,000 to get out of jail. And, of course, he asked Grandpa not call his parents.

Luckily, Grandma knew a scam when she heard one and put a quick stop to it by getting Grandpa to verify with his real son before proceeding further. She then contacted the Sarasota Sheriff's Office to report the crime and gave them the number listed on her caller ID.

I love happy endings. In this case, a savvy senior outwitted a slimy scammer—and saved the bacon!

Virtual kidnapping

Scammers and con artists keep inventing and reinventing ways to steal your money. They test new cons everyday, so it seems.

The hottest new scam is virtual kidnapping

Never heard of it? It's a new one to me too.

Scammers are terrifying people and separating them from their hardearned money. But no kidnapping actually occurs. Here's how it works.

A person claiming to be an emergency professional, like a supposed paramedic or nurse, calls you on the telephone and convinces you that your grandchild is in peril

and will be killed unless your bank wires a large sum of money via Western Union. A conspiring person, using a phony accent to sound like a stereotypical Hollywood gangster, takes over the conversation in a profane, heated, threatening manner.

These calls are random, and the callers have no clue who they are actually calling. They are so skilled at the game, it doesn't matter. They just dial. And, more often than not, they get the money during the 20- to 30-minute, terrifying phone call.

How to protect yourself

Just like I always remind you to do with all suspicious calls, just hang up and call the Sheriff's Office.

Real emergency professionals would never participate in that type of call. The con artists count on creating panic or confusion to scare you.



Wanted dead or alive?

I get phishing emails quite a bit, and I'm sure most of you do, too. Phishing emails are all pretty much the same. First of all, the senders don't know your name and second, the grammar used sounds childish or like broken English.

The email usually starts with "Dear Sir or Madam," "Hello Friend," or so forth. After you read a convoluted story, the basic premise claims the sender will put a lot of money into your bank account if you send your banking information.

We all should be tired of that one by now, right? But wait; there's more!

Yikes! There's a contract on my head?

I recently got one that gave me pause. To begin, the sender's name was Bob Mathews, which sounds like a real person you might know. And it used my complete name, spelled correctly. Then it went on to tell me there is a contract out on my life by a person I have offended.

The writer had received orders "to remove me," but felt he should give me a chance because the order might be unfair. And, his fee to let me live was only \$2200 in bitcoin.

Bitcoin? What?

Maybe you have heard of it; maybe not. But, bitcoin is a type of digital currency where encryption techniques are used to regulate the generation of units of currency and verify the transfer of funds, operating independently of a central bank. It's a hot commodity among speculators and can be used for online transactions between individuals.

Well, I guess I am a dead man

walking because I don't have a clue where to get bitcoin. My bank in The Meadows Shopping Village couldn't help me out either because they don't deal in cryptocurrency.

I was curious where this ransom

I was curious where this ransom threat came from and was able to trace it back to a Russian server—a "Russian Bot" (robot)—but could not get any further information beyond that.

Sold on the Dark Web

(Dark Web—noun

The part of the World Wide Web that is only accessible by means of special software, allowing users and website operators to remain anonymous or untraceable.)

I suspect my real name and primary email address, along with other personal information was stolen along with information of 145 million other clients in the big Equifax breach last year and sold for pennies in bulk sale on the Dark Web.

State-sponsored criminals regularly buy stolen personal information on the so-called Dark Web, security experts say. The black market sites where this information is sold are far more exclusive than black markets where stolen credit card data is sold.

It's just another type of phishing attempt

Ransom emails to companies and corporations are prevalent these days, but this is the first time I've seen or heard of an email in The Meadows directed specifically at one individual.

If you should receive a threatening email demanding ransom for any reason—please—don't worry about it. No one is going to "remove" you. Just send it on to me, and I will see it gets to the appropriate law enforcement.

Synergy: noun. The whole is worth more than the sum of its individual parts.

It was a buzzword in the '90s, but I hadn't thought much about it recently until the top shelf of my dishwasher fell apart. Those plastic parts lying on the kitchen floor weren't worth two cents, but when the repairman put the parts back together and I didn't have to wash my glassware by hand—priceless!

I thought about synergy again at the Craft Group. One group was working on Iris cards, exchanging ideas about which colors to use for their mosaic-like designs and the embellishments that would give just the right finishing touch. There was an assembly line constructing a choir of angels; another making three-dimensional cards. Jewelry makers were taking a break from their usual designs to add sparkling beads to Christmas ornaments.

With the return of seasonal residents, the room was filled with women proving that by working together, they were achieving more than they could have accomplished by working separately and having more fun doing it—it was synergistic!

Along with returning members of the group, we are glad to welcome new members every week.

Some, like Annik Coudert, had lived in The Meadows for years

Annik, a native of France, who had lived in Virginia and taught French to adults in Washington DC, has been here since 2006, but she never considered joining the Craft Group. Then her neighbors, Dottie Barr and Linda Shaw saw some of the little things she made at home and told her that she should come along with them and join the group.

Annik began making Iris cards, which she learned were fun to make and not too difficult. She found the members were nice and most of all, she likes the ambiance, the atmosphere of the group, and finds the two hours she spends here passes too quickly.

Others, like Debbie Tasker were new, seasonal residents in The Meadows

Although **Debbie** had been the director of an adult education program and the statewide supervisor of New Hampshire's GED program, she was a little nervous about coming to the Craft Group. She knew no one in the group and had never done crafts. She wasn't sure whether she was artistic enough or what her reception might be. Still, she read about it in *The* Meadoword and figured she could glue. Moreover, she was looking for a way to volunteer for something useful that could be done on a shortterm basis. Making crafts for sale to

support charities appealed to her.

Her apprehension quickly disappeared as Sonia Sutcliffe began explaining how to make Iris fold cards. "She was a patient teacher and had the process broken down step-by-step," says Debbie. Two hours later, Debbie completed her first card, a gorgeous dolphin design, and she was hooked. She even bought supplies so she can make cards at home as well as on Wednesday mornings. Even though she could do them on her own, Debbie finds it inspiring to be with the group where artistic, creative people interact and produce new ideas.

This creative interaction also appealed to another newcomer Melinda Gordan

Melinda (Celebration of Fine Arts featured artist in this month's *Meadoword*) is a classically trained artist, who taught art to Philadelphia middle schoolers for 35 years. She continues to draw and paint, primarily in acrylics with some colored pencil work. You'll see her work at the annual Celebration of Fine Arts on March 17 and 18 at the MCA Community Center.

Melinda loves Pop Art and the work of painters like Peter Max, who made art accessible to everyone. She had never done any crafts.

On her first day at the Craft Group, she was drawn to the small group making three-dimensional cards. The cards are made in layers and require precision, free-hand cutting around complex designs using the aptly-named Exacto knife.

Melinda was accustomed to using Exactos to cut mats, and the tool felt familiar in her hand. She began cutting designs like a pro—well, actually she is a pro. She moved on to using a shaping tool to add depth to the leaves and flower petals that would be added to the cards. She found it similar to relief work on metal, but because it's done with paper, it's much more delicate. It's fun for her to use her skills in new ways, and she's been impressed with the group's ideas. "They listen to each other. They're very welcoming and, consequently, everyone can bring their ideas to the table to invent and create together. It's an enjoyable two hours," Melissa concludes.

It's synergy

Perhaps Henry Ford put it best when he said, "Coming together is the beginning. Learning together is progress. Working together is success."





The Meadows Book Club March Book Preview

Georgia: A Novel of Georgia O'Keeffe by Dawn Tripp


"I no longer love you as I once did, in the dazzling rush of those early days" reads the first line of Georgia: A *Novel of Georgia O'Keeffe* (© 2016; Random House). In the novel, author Dawn Tripp imagines the voice of the renowned artist, Georgia O'Keeffe. O'Keeffe, who is known by some only for her work depicting flowers and bleached skulls, reveals the talent and passion that brought her from her birthplace in Wisconsin, to teaching in Texas, to photographer and modern art promoter Alfred Stieglitz's Gallery 291 in New York, to her own haven in New Mexico.

Georgia O'Keeffe was born in Sun Prairie, Wisconsin, in 1887, the second of seven children. She had early lessons in drawing and painting before studying art at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago and attending the Art Students League in New York City, where she won a prize for her oil painting Dead Rabbit with Copper Pot. (Georgia O'Keeffe, Untitled, Dead Rabbit with Copper Pot, 1908, Art Students League of New York collection)

O'Keeffe studied under many of the famous artists of her day, including John Vanderpoel, William Merritt Chase, and Kenyon Cox. She worked as a commercial artist and art teacher at various times in her early career when money for her education ran out. Though she painted in oils and watercolor, the works that brought her to the attention of Stieglitz, who later became her husband, were charcoal abstractions. It was only in the early 1920s, after her first exhibition of abstracts, that she began painting flowers, eventually producing more than 200 flower paintings. Perhaps the most famous of these is Jimson Weed, painted in 1932, which sold at auction in 2014 for more than \$44 million.

Supported and encouraged by Stieglitz, O'Keeffe produced a series of paintings of cityscapes after moving to New York in 1925. She visited New Mexico around 1929 where a new source of inspiration took hold of her—the Southwest. She traveled there annually and eventually retired to New Mexico where she died at age 98 in 1986.

O'Keeffe is credited with establishing the American modernism movement, though she vehemently rejected almost all "-isms" and especially disdained being called a



"woman artist." Surely the greatest influence on her life and work was Stieglitz. Married at the time they met. and more than 20 years her senior, he nevertheless provided the means for her to develop her art, encouraging her endlessly, introducing her to his artistic associates, and providing the funding and space she required to explore her gift. He also was completely obsessed with her, leaving his wife and daughter to be with O'Keeffe. His own creative output was so heavily influenced by her that he produced more than 350 portraits and nudes of her. Their relationship was at times tumultuous, including separations and affairs, though they stayed together until his death in 1946.

Winner of the Massachusetts Book Award for fiction, Dawn Tripp, born in Newton, Massachusetts, in 1969, is also the author of the novels Moon Tide (2012), The Season of Open Water (2007), and Game of Secrets (2011). Georgia was reviewed in the New York Times Book Review: "Complex and original . . . Georgia conveys O'Keeffe's joys and disappointments, rendering both the woman and the artist with keenness and consideration." The Denver Post was also laudatory: "Sexually charged . . . insightful . . . Dawn Tripp humanizes an artist who is seen in biographies as more icon than woman. Her sensuous novel is as finely rendered as an O'Keeffe painting."

Family Secrets

I thought every family except mine had a deep, dark secret. My dad bragged that among his eight brothers and sisters and my mom's sister there had been no divorces, and the marriages had all lasted for decades. Dad and Mom were married on November 7, 1941, at Mom's home in Follansbee, West Virginia. I was born on March 27, 1943. My brother Jim

came along six years later, and Jane was born two years later. The boys were planned. Jane was the result of a wild Labor Day weekend party at Lake Erie, but that was not much of a secret.

But, when I was in junior high school and looked through an old, dusty family scrapbook, I saw that Mom was married and divorced before she married Dad. Mom and Dad dated on and off during high school, but in an impulsive moment in the summer

of 1937, just after her senior year in high school, Mom married Martin Riehl, the captain of the football team. The impulse quickly wore off, and she sought a divorce. The judge somehow granted her a divorce on the grounds that Martin was "dull and boring." I never heard of those reasons used in a divorce settlement, but Mom claimed that it worked for her. The judge, however, ruled that she could not get

married again for one year. Dad reentered her life, and they were married four years later.

I didn't learn all this until years later. When I confronted them after finding the scrapbook, Dad brushed it off by saying, "They were only married a short time."

"Don't tell anyone," said Mom. In the story below, **Valeda Lee**

tells of her husband's family secret.

The Phone Call

Valeda Lee

No one expected that phone call... but one day, it came.

"You have a sister! She lives in England."

A sister? In England? The call came from Cousin Alva in Darby, Pennsylvania, to the Lee siblings in Chicago, Illinois, in 1975. Alva informed them they had a sister named Enid Jones, who was born in Jamaica and lived in Bristol, England, after immigrating there as a young woman.

The Lee siblings knew their mother, Evelyn, and her sister, Minna, (Cousin Alva's mother) were born and raised in Jamaica, then moved to the States as young women to seek better lives. What the siblings did not know was that their mother had given birth to a daughter, Enid, in 1923 in Jamaica.

When Evelyn moved to the United States, she left her daughter in Jamaica to be raised by the grandparents. When little Enid was four years old, her grandmother died; Enid was then left in the care of several aunts and cousins—moving "from pillar to post," as Enid later described it.

After Evelyn immigrated to Grand Rapids, Michigan, she met and married Arthur Lee. She did not tell Arthur about her daughter in Jamaica, and when they began to have children, it must have felt more and more impossible to divulge her secret. Evelyn and Arthur went on to have six children. Life was a struggle; there was never enough money. Evelyn secretly sent a little money to Jamaica when she could, but it wasn't much or very often. As her family increased and expenses grew, even that little bit had to stop.

Evelyn worked hard to keep her secret. When her Jamaican relatives, who had moved to various cities in the U.S., came to Grand Rapids to visit, Evelyn met them at the door to remind them not to mention Enid. What a terrible burden the secret must have been for her and for her relatives! Unfortunately, the longer a secret is kept; the more difficult it is to tell.

Enid did not have a happy childhood. She was aware that her mom had a new family in the States and sadly thought that her American siblings were living the good life, with plenty of money, while she was very poor in Jamaica. When she was 16 years old, she left school before graduation, learned sewing, and worked as a seamstress. She later met an American man, who was visiting Jamaica, and fell in love and married him in 1956. They had a daughter, Jennifer, but the marriage ended in divorce five years later, and Enid's ex returned to the States.

In 1961, Enid left Jamaica for Bristol, England, where she had several cousins. She found work in a cigarette factory and later in a hospital as a nurses aide.

One fateful day, Enid's cousin Alva visited from the States—a visit that Enid insists was God-given. Alva promised she would get in touch with Enid's siblings, but, of course, she couldn't do it while Enid's mother, Evelyn, was alive. After Evelyn's death, Alva was finally able to make the life-changing phone call.

A sister! A sister!

In 1976, two of Enid's siblings, Wilbur and Irene, traveled to Bristol to meet their sister Enid and her daughter Jenny. They had a wonderful two-week visit. Then in 1977, Enid and Jenny came to the States and spent a month, meeting and getting to know her other siblings, nieces, and nephews. What a glorious visit! Enid had finally met her entire family.

For everyone, the family was now complete. And any doubt that her siblings might have had about Enid's identity was instantly erased once they saw her—she was the spitting image of their mom.

Enid wanted so much to be with her family. Finally, in 1981, she was able to move to the United States. Her new home was in Chicago, where all her siblings lived except for her brother Arthur, who lived in Ann Arbor, Michigan. The family loved getting to know one another, and each

day brought more joy. Enid and Jenny lived with her brother and sister-in-law for a while, but once Enid found work at a hospital, they were able to get their own apartment. Enid eventually became a U.S. citizen.

Enid was proud and happy to see that her brothers and sisters were doing well. Wilbur was an engineer, Clifford was an artist, Bobby worked at Sears, Art was a teacher, Irene was a school secretary/travel agent, and Florene was a secretary. Daughter Jenny was so happy to finally meet her aunts, uncles, and 11 cousins, and there were many family gatherings full of laughter and catching up.

The siblings had a good laugh when Enid told them she grew up thinking they enjoyed well-to-do lives as American children, when the truth was they felt that they were the poorest family in the neighborhood. So poor, in fact, that when Evelyn was pregnant with their fourth baby, she was so sure they couldn't afford to raise another child she arranged to have it adopted by a relative.

Fortunately, baby Arthur (my future husband at the time) was born on Thanksgiving Day and, believing it was a message from God to keep him, she did so.

The Lee kids probably had it as rough as Enid did. Some years the only Christmas gifts they received were from the Santa Claus Girls, a charitable organization that helped poor families. Often neighbors gave them food when they needed it.

The difference was—even though they were very poor—they all had each other, while Enid grew up feeling alone and sometimes unloved by the various relatives who had to care for her.

Life continues for the Lee family. Their children grew up, went to

college, and started their own lives and families. Wilbur, Florene, Clifford, and Bobby died. Sadly, Enid's daughter Jenny passed away in 2009.

Enid, now a spry 94 years old, lives in an assisted living facility. She is an avid Chicago Bulls fan, regularly watching their games on television. She also attends local high school games with her sister Irene. (Irene says that Enid climbs up into the bleachers with more agility than most of the fans.)

Today, Enid has mild dementia, but remains a happy woman who is delighted to have one sister and brother still living. Some people in this situation might feel bitterness over the lost years. But if Enid ever felt that way, she never expressed it. Apparently, she chooses to simply enjoy finally finding her family and being with them when she can.

Poor Evelyn—she had to live with her secret all her life. She never got to know her firstborn child except through sporadic news from her relatives in Jamaica. We can only speculate about the reasons she felt she had to leave baby Enid. Maybe she planned to send for her later; maybe she felt that being an unmarried mother was too shameful; maybe she just felt unready for the responsibilities of motherhood at that time. And, we can only guess why she felt she had to keep Enid a secret from her husband.

Evelyn never returned to Jamaica. When her son Arthur wanted to take her back to visit so she could see her former home and family, he couldn't understand why she always refused to go. Now, too late, he understands.

The siblings often wonder what everyone's lives would have been like if Evelyn had felt free to tell her husband about Enid. What if they had been able to bring her to America when she was a child? What they know is they all feel thankful they got that phone call.

the fireplace, achieving clean lines that are appealing in their simplicity.

Renovation goals achieved







of Sarasota third-grade students at multiple schools. This year, there were over 800 participants, who learned the beginning lessons of edible gardening skills.


