Having Healthy Trees Does Matter

PROPER CARE OF YOUR TREES WILL HELP THEM SURVIVE A STORM

The strong winds we experienced from hurricane Ian caused the loss of or damage to many of our trees in The Meadows. Some of the fallen trees were laurel oaks which were nearing the end of their life span but many other trees were damaged or toppled. Some of the trees that were lost might have survived if they had received periodic inspection or care by a quality tree specialist.

Our beautiful live oak trees are among the strongest trees, and can live for centuries. That is why we recommend replacing lost trees with live oaks to preserve the beauty of The Meadows far into the future. The strength of the live oak was appreciated by the Continental Congress. When they ordered the first six frigates for the U.S. Navy they specified they should be

made of live oak. Old Ironsides got its reputation when cannon balls bounced off of its live oak sides.


Some of the trees lost were pine trees that had been infected by pine beetles or palm trees that had been suffering from palm fungus. Both of these conditions can be controlled by periodic injections which will protect them and keep them healthy. There is some cost to treat your trees, but it is much less than you would incur to have the trees removed and replanted.

One of the best things you can do to protect your trees is to have them inspected and trimmed. A tree with a full canopy that is covered with Spanish moss will put up a lot of resistance to the wind and make it more likely to be lost in a storm. Very few properly

daylighted and trimmed trees were toppled during the storm.

Now is a good time to check on the structural integrity of your trees. Trees that remained standing after the storm could have sustained damage that make them a hazard to people and property. As I write this we are several weeks after Ian and there are still trees and limbs falling due to damage they suffered in the high wind.

The Standards Committee has taken on the task of looking for damaged trees that could present a hazard and will report them but they can't spot them all. Many thanks to them and our hard working staff for the service they are providing during this difficult recovery period.





MEADOW'S WEATHER/HURRICANE ANALYSIS: OCTOBER 2022 REPORT

Roy Wysnewski — Meadow's Weather/Climate/Hurricane Analysis

WEATHER SUMMARY

With the end of the 2022 hurricane season (Nov. 30), and with a prospect for some of the coolest temperatures of the year to occur in December, the weather outlook for the forthcoming holiday season is bright!

October average temperature was near normal, but rainfall was one-half what we normally expect.

TEMPERATURE ANALYSIS

In the aftermath of Hurricane lan, a new temperature pattern set in – one that carried over into October and subsequently resulted in an overall monthly temperature of 85.4 F. This was one degree short of normal – the first time we've experienced a below normal month in the past two and a half years!

Other statistics for the month include sixteen above-normal temperature days and, for the first time in thirty-four consecutive months, no record high-temperature days!

RAINFALL ANALYSIS

If your recollection of The Meadows rainfall over the past two months is 'feast or famine' – you are right on! Following record rainfall in September, we

experienced a really dry October. In fact, it was one of the four driest months in the past twentyfour years.

The year-to-date total (60.4") now exceeds our expected end-of-the year twelve-month average (51.6) by more than one-half foot of water and puts us in position to have one of the rainiest years in history!


Monthly temperature and rainfall data are presented in the graph.

HURRICANE SEASON ANALYSIS

Weather experts report that the odds for a tropical cyclone – of any strength – to develop in the Gulf of Mexico after November 30, are very low to nil. However, due to our changing climate, the prospects for late fall and winter storms to deposit record, and even historic, inland rainfall amounts are increasing. We experienced record monthly rainfall of 9.7 inches (300% above average) in December 2018. Hurricane Ian is a good example of the devastation and 'horror' that flooding alone – surge and wind aside - can produce.

Therefore, even though the hurricane season has ended, we must continue our preparedness for such events.





SAFETY REPORT

LATEST HOLIDAY SCAMS

Holiday scams capitalize on the increase in online shopping, travel, and charitable giving during the holiday season by trying to trick you into giving up money, gift cards, or sensitive information.

Last year, nearly 75% of Americans experienced at least one of these holiday scams listed in this article. The consequences can be steep.

Fake charities that steal your money

Scammers will try and take advantage of your generosity by creating fake charities, GoFundMe campaigns, and other charitable activities. "Lookalike" charities are often created that use variations of trusted names to fool you.

 Before giving money to charities, research them through the Better Business Bureau's Wise Giving Alliance or Charity Navigator. For GoFundMe and similar campaigns, look into the organizer or group behind it before donating.

Gift card scams (including empty gift cards)

Scammers love gift cards, they're almost impossible to trace. They buy and sell fraudulent gift cards or trick you into giving up the numbers on the backs of gift cards by impersonating your bank or government agencies.

Cybercriminals create fake stores or Craigslist for discounted gift cards. if you send them money, you'll receive an empty gift card in return.

 When purchasing gift cards, ensure haven't been tampered with. Check the back to see if the PIN has been exposed. Get a receipt in case your card is lost or stolen. Only purchase gift cards from reputable retailers. If you buy online, check the store's URL to see if it's secure. Never pay an "activation fee" for a gift card.

 Only use gift cards as gifts. If anyone asks you to pay fees or "protect your money" by buying gift cards, it's a scam.

Lookalike online stores offering big discounts

With more people than ever before shopping online since the start of the pandemic, it's important to know how to shop online safely. Scammers create online stores with deeply discounted prices to trick you into buying from them. DON'T. They'll either steal your credit card number or force you to use payment methods that can't be reversed (such as wire transfers, payment apps like Zelle, or gift cards).

- They advertise significant discounts (50% off or more) on all of their items. If an obscure online store offers the best available prices online, there's a good chance it's a scam.
- Fake websites show signs of a scam, with poor spelling and grammar, bad quality images, and fake sounding reviews.
- Often they are missing basic company information: ie., an "About Us" page, contact information, address, or details on returns.
- Buy from trusted online stores.
 Do your research. Use a credit card for your purchase.

Phishing Scams

During the holidays, scammers send phishing messages claiming to be from companies like Amazon or Apple and offer special discounts or claim that your account has been hacked.

These scams lure you with special offers or prizes to a fake website or infect your device with malware. Look for strange spelling, grammar, and formatting issues.

 Ignore emails and texts from people you don't know. Never click on unfamiliar links. When in doubt, log in to your account or contact the company directly.

Fraudulent seasonal jobs

Scammers prey on people looking to make extra cash by posting fake job listings offering good money for little work.

- They want to steal your personal information during the "hiring process" or trick you into sending them money for "supplies/ training."
- They hire right away, or the interview takes place over WhatsApp or Telegram and immediately start asking for your Social Security number, bank accounts, or tax information.

Missed delivery notification scam texts

One recent scam involves fraudsters sending fake delivery notification text messages, in hopes that you'll click on the link that takes you to a fake website to either steal your personal information, ask for your credit card number, or to send them money. You're asked to enter sensitive information. FedEX, UPS, and other delivery companies won't ask for your SSN or credit card number to "find" your delivery. Don't use their link. Track deliveries through the delivery company's official website using the provided tracking number.

Grandparent scams fraudsters posing as family

This especially insidious scam mainly targets senior citizens. According to the FBI, elder fraud costs victims \$3 billion in losses each year. Scammers text or email posing as a grandchild in trouble and ask for money — usually through wire transfers or gift cards.

 When in doubt, trust your gut.
 Call the family member directly to confirm.

Holiday travel and online airfare scams

With travel opening back up, many people are looking for cheap airline tickets. Scammers target travelers with bogus flight-booking websites & fraudulent flight cancellation emails and sudden price increases.

 Purchase airline tickets directly from the airline (or through reputable third-party sellers with customer service). If you receive any messages about your trip, contact the airline directly.

Warning signs of a fake online giveaway or survey

You're asked to provide sensitive information in return for a free gift or prize. Don't, IT'S A SCAM — especially if you never entered the giveaway.

Unprotected WiFi

Resist the temptation to shop over Wi-Fi when you're out during the holiday season. Public Wi-Fi is notoriously easy to hack.







COCONOG RECIPE

Ingredients

1 can of full-fat coconut milk

 $1\,\%$ cups of vanilla almond milk

2 teaspoons of vanilla extract

1 heaping teaspoon each of nutmeg and cinnamon

½ teaspoon of turmeric

¼ cup of maple syrup

1 packet of stevia

Instructions

Put all of the ingredients in the blender and give it a quick blend. Serve freshly blended. Dust with nutmeg, if desired. Store leftovers in the refrigerator. Serves four to six, or several mini party glasses.

Think Healthy

Turmeric, a functional food, contains iron, fiber, vitamins, and magnesium. It is an anti-inflammatory used for pain relief and may also help prevent certain cancers.





COMMON PARASITES IN

DOGS 8CAT

For years, parasites in your dog or cat were a constant threat to your pet's health. In the early days of my career, we would diagnose all types of worms in dogs and cats every day. Today, finding these same worms is rare. We would find some pets so debilitated by parasites that death was possible. Puppies were at great risk of severe disease from these worms. People were also at risk of infection by these parasites. The two most common parasitic worms in puppies are hookworms and roundworms.

Hookworms are transmitted directly in the uterus to the puppies. The larvae are activated during pregnancy in the mother's body. The puppies are then born carrying the hookworm larvae. The larvae migrate to the intestines, mature to adults and "hook" onto the gut by hooks in the head of the worm. This can cause bleeding, which, in heavy infestations, will cause anemia, diarrhea, and death. As

the hookworms mature, they mate and produce thousands of eggs which will mix with intestine contents and pass with the stool. The eggs that come from the stool can remain infective on the ground for months. Therefore, it is very important to remove any stool that may contain eggs so your dog will not continue to become reinfected. People can also become infected with hookworm larvae that can invade the skin through cuts. The condition is called Cutaneous Larval Migrans because the larvae cause skin irritation from migrating under the skin. Adult dogs acquire the worms by ingesting the eggs from the contaminated soil which hatch. and the larvae migrate to the lungs. They are then coughed up by the dog, then swallowed back to the gut where they mature and start producing eggs. These worms could be eliminated with routine deworming medications; however, reinfestation is always a problem. Today, we have heartworm preventions which contain a drug to kill the hookworms monthly. The use of

monthly preventions has nearly eliminated this problem.

Roundworms have a similar route to maturation. They are also contracted in the uterus by the puppies. We assume that all puppies have parasites because of this transmission. People can also contract the roundworm larvae from puppies. Children seem more apt to get these larvae by ingestion while playing with the pup and eating at the same time or putting hands in/around their mouths. This infestation is called Visceral Larval Migrans because these larvae migrate through the body's organs. A very dangerous spot of migration is in the human eye, which mimics a severe form of ocular cancer in children. Unfortunately, some children's eyes have been removed only to find that it was not cancer, but a roundworm infection. These worms are also less prominent due to the advances in monthly heartworm preventions. Ultimately, we should always remember to wash up after playing with our puppies.



Being around birds make people feel 'chirpy' boosting mental wellbeing, according to a new study.

Seeing or hearing birds provides a lift to mental health—with the boost lasting for up to eight hours, according to the findings.

Researchers used a phone app called Urban Mind. People were asked three times a day whether they could see or hear birds, and afterwards they responded to questions about their mental wellbeing.

"There is growing evidence on the mental health benefits of being around nature and we intuitively think that the presence of birdsong and birds would help lift our mood," said lead author Ryan Hammoud of King's College London.

"However, there is little research that has actually investigated the impact of birds on mental health in real-time and in a real environment. By using the Urban Mind app we have for the first time showed the direct link between seeing or hearing birds and positive mood."

The 3-year study involved more than 1,200 participants



who completed over 26,800 assessments using the Urban Mind app. These participants were mainly based in the UK, the EU and the US.

The study also collected information on existing diagnoses of mental health conditions such as depression. Through their findings they found that hearing and seeing birdlife improved the mental health of people with and without depression.

An interesting data point showed that the birds' habitat, such as the sun-dabbled wood or the babbling brook, were not required for this improvement in mood.

"The term ecosystem services is often used to describe the benefits of certain aspects of the natural environment on our physical and mental health. However, it can be

difficult to prove these benefits scientifically," said senior author Professor Andrea Mechelli, of King's College London.

"Our study provides an evidence base for creating and supporting biodiverse spaces that harbor birdlife, since this is strongly linked with our mental health."

"In addition, the findings support the implementation of measures to increase opportunities for people to come across birdlife, particularly for those living with mental health conditions such as depression," he said.

The finds aren't particularly surprising, in 2021, GNN reported that German scientists has found that being surrounding by a wide variety of birds can offer increasing life satisfaction equivalent to \$150 per week of added income.

Holiday Memories

As families and friends gather for the holidays, there comes a time after the gifts have been opened, the dinner eaten and cups of eggnog downed, that someone says, "Remember the time when....." Then the stories pour forth. Those stories are a part of what makes the holidays bright. They are the shared experiences that remind us of who we are and how we got that way. They may become family legends to be told again and again but too often even those stories slip away from memory as the years pass.

In my family, we all remember the year when we awoke on Christmas morning to a broken furnace and an indoor temperature in the 30's. As we huddled around the oven with its door opened for warmth, we experienced a Christmas miracle. A nearby furnace repairman answered his phone and agreed to make a house call on Christmas day. He arrived within minutes and had the furnace fixed in an hour.

Other stories only become known if they are talked about. That's why Bob and I shared the saga of our first Christmas tree. A disagreement over proper tree trimming procedures led to me decorating the tree alone. Then a disagreement over who should undecorate and remove the tree led to the tree sitting in our living room for weeks as its needles slowly dropped to the rug. How the tree finally left probably explains one reason why 56 years later we were still in love.

Those stories will be remembered because they were both written down to be read in the Memoir Group. In fact, they were published in the Dec. 2014 and Dec. 2016 editions of *The Meadoword* and can be read on-line in the MCA website. "The Barn" which follows completes a trilogy of holiday memories. The news came after everyone had opened their gifts. Bob's mother and his Aunt Bess announced that The Barn would be passed on to whoever had the first grandchild. Eyes widened and there were a few gasps from my husband's s siblings and cousins. The Barnetts were not the type of family who handed down heirlooms that you might see on Antiques Roadshow. The Barn was as good an inheritance as they expected to see.

The Barn was a detailed replica of an old-fashioned barn which a neighbor had made for my mother-in-law and her sister when they were little girls. It was beautifully hand-crafted with wide barn-doors that opened, downspouts, a metal shingled roof and a silo designed to hold a Christmas tree. It had been a centerpiece of the Barnett's Christmas decorations for as long as Bob and I had been married and had belonged to Aunt Bess's family before that. Now it was up for grabs.

Initially, I saw little reason for excitement. Bob and I had not had a tree since the first year of our marriage. Then Bob's mother shot me a look that suggested Christmas would not be a time of peace on earth and goodwill toward me if I didn't deliver. My palms began to sweat and I felt a little nauseated. It might have been panic or it could have been

morning sickness. I was pregnant. And so was Bob's cousin, Anne. The race was on.

Fortunately for me, our daughter arrived right on time. Bob's
Aunt Bess never quite forgave her daughter Anne for losing the race to give birth by three weeks, and in the years to come, neither did Bob. Since we had a child and The Barn, we felt obligated to have a tree. That was when the trouble started.

Things began innocently enough. We bought a cut tree at the Big Brothers fund-raiser and felt good about supporting a worthy cause. That warm glow lasted until we tried to put the tree into The Barn's silo. Bob picked up the tree and I knelt to guide it into place. The tree wouldn't go in. "Move it to the left," I suggested. When Bob moved it in the opposite direction, I repeated the directions a bit louder. Then I began shouting, "No to the left. the left!" When that didn't work, I began waving my right hand to show where the tree should go and the initial problem became clear. I am dyslexic and often mix-up right and left especially in stressful situations. Finally, I grabbed the bottom of the tree and moved it into place. But that was not the end of our problem.

It was nearly impossible to fit an actual tree through the opening of the silo. Tree trunks did not



conform to the shape of the perfectly perpendicular silo. To compensate for the irregularities of tree trunks, The Barn's silo had been constructed with a series of screws to hold the tree in place. But once the trunk was in place, the screws could barely be reached by human hands. Over the years we learned that setting up the tree would require the joint efforts of whatever friends and neighbors Bob could round up (only true friends came back a second year) and lubrication by at least a six-pack of beer.

Once in The Barn, the tree always leaned to the left. Despite what Bob might have said, I never complained much about the tree not being straight. After a while I accepted the fact that men probably have some sort of perceptual deficit which interferes with their ability to see whether things are perpendicular. I only occasionally pointed out that the leaning got progressively worse each year. After all, we felt a sense of triumph every time we got the tree up. We loved having our tree in The Barn and

felt that its leaning was a small price to pay to have this tie to our heritage. Our annual ritual with The Barn continued until the day when just as we had gathered at the dining room table and Bob had begun carving the turkey, the tree began leaning further to the left. As we watched transfixed, the tree slowly and majestically descended onto the table, into the midst of Christmas dinner.

As soon as our daughters married, Bob announced that The Barn would go to whoever had the first grandchild. For years thereafter, The Barn occupied a permanent place in our older daughter's dining room, holding bare branches from which seasonal decorations were hung. The Barn barely survived a recent move from CT to VA and no longer looks like the pristine, perfectly preserved barn of 50 years ago. That barn exists only in our memories and it will slip away forever unless its story is written down.

On Wednesday, December 14th, the Meadows Book Club will discuss the novel **West with** Giraffes by Lynda Rutledge (Lake Union Publishing-2021). I will be the discussion leader for this delightful novel.

For those who have commented that our book club only reads books about "strong women," here is a counter to that opinion. It is a fictionalized account of a 17-year-old lad who has run away from the drought-ravaged Panhandle of Texas in fear of the police who finds himself on a New Jersey dock as two African giraffes are being offloaded. There is much to do about the giraffes partly because of their survival of an Atlantic hurricane that hit New York, but also because they are destined to travel cross-country over land to the San Diego Zoo where they

will be the first zoo giraffes in Southern California.

It is 1938; the Depression is taking its toll not only on the economy but the spirit of Americans; these giraffes will provide relief and joy as they make their way on a 12-day trek. Newspapers along the route herald their coming and draw large crowds.

Young Woodrow Wilson Nickel has finagled himself into the driver's seat, accompanied by zookeeper Riley Jones, who was tasked by the female zoo owner to transport the animals in a crudely-made flat-bed rig to accommodate the giraffes' height, that of itself brings laughter from viewers.

The story is told in the firstperson voice of 105-year-old Woody who, concerned about the disappearance in the world of giraffes and other magnificent creatures, feels compelled to write the account of his adventure and love for the giraffes. Many challenges are faced: treacherous mountainous roads, low underpasses and small bridges, and a flash flood in which a young, aspiring photojournalist "Red" — who has followed their journey – proves her mettle.

Woody has fallen in love with Red and after the giraffes are safely delivered, he uses his earnings to search for her.

"Central to this story is the promotion of animals as worthy of human devotion. It's about hope, resilience, love and the importance of memory and storytelling." (Goodreads)

A professional writer for over 25 years, Lynda Rutledge has worked as a copywriter, restaurant and film reviewer, book collaborator, nonfiction author, travel writer, and freelance journalist. She holds an MFA in creative writing, an MA in American literature, and has won awards and residencies

from the Illinois Arts Council, Writers League of Texas, Ragdale Foundation, Atlantic Center for the Arts, Squaw Valley Community of Writers, and Sewanee Writers Conference. Her debut novel Faith Bass Darling's Last Garage Sale won the 2013 Writers League of Texas Novel of the Year and was adapted into a major French film. Currently, she lives with her husband and resident dog outside Austin, Texas.



- Buying all the gifts from the "12 Days of Christmas" would cost you a ton of money—the most expensive being "Swans a Swimming," about \$6,300.
- There are about 16 different ways to spell Hanukkah. The word 'Hanukkah' means 'dedication.'
- Toys for Tots was founded in Los Angeles, California in 1947. A handmade doll was the first donation, and more than 5,000 toys were collected during that first drive.
