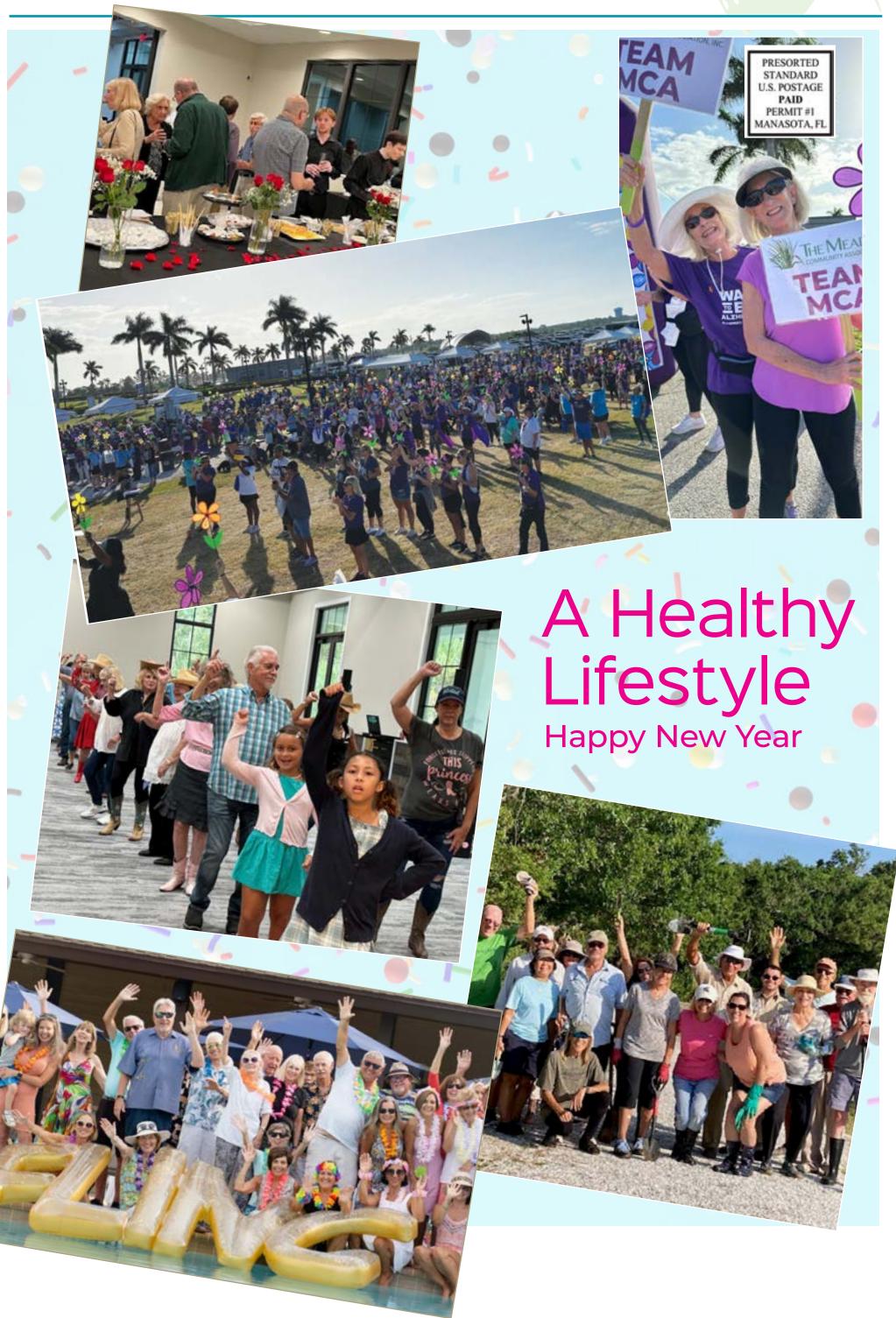

Healthy Community = Repairs, Replacements and Capital

Improvements

Keeping our community healthy not only pertains to the residents and their lifestyle but also to the health of the community's physical environment. It is the MCA's role to ensure that The Meadows is maintained and in good working condition. The MCA's Board of Directors both past and present number one goal has been to preserve The Meadows property values. So much so, that in 2019 the Renaissance of The Meadows was born out of the understanding that our community was aging and capital improvements needed to be made in order to keep our community viable.

Since the Renaissance's inception we redesigned the new entry at 17th St., built a new community building, a dog park, a new deck at the Center Court Lounge, made structural improvements to the Regency Room, developed the Renaissance Access Plan increasing our residents'

recreational offerings, created a well-rounded lifestyle and wellness program and established environmental initiatives to protect the natural beauty of The Meadows. We have planted over 36 trees and 8,000 aquatic plants.

Feeling Safe in The Meadows

We keep the community informed



of suspicious activity through The Meadoword and Constant Contacts to alert residents to mischievous activity that may be happening in The Meadows. A healthy community is one in which residents feel safe.

Today the Renaissance is still at the forefront of our minds as th MCA team works to advance the vision and mission of The Meadows forward.

PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE

Each year we continue to improve, repair, and maintain our assets. The MCA maintenance staff performs quarterly inspections on common area elements. These elements range from inspection and repair of bridges, benches, dog stations, fences, fitness / nature trails, fountains, sidewalks, stormwater headwalls, swales, and irrigation.

That's not all, every year an annual common area palm tree trimming,

biennial oak tree trimming, removal of diseased and failing trees along with refreshing and mulching landscape beds, planting new trees and adding aquatic vegetation, all contribute to the effort to keep The Meadows community well maintained and looking it's best.

RECENT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS Maintenance Facility

We didn't build any buildings this year, but we did take one down. Why? Because The Meadows Maintenance facility reached the end of its useful life and was no longer practical to invest good money in a building whose structure was showing signs of failure. Instead, we moved the MCA team to the same facility as the Club's maintenance team where they could both operate independently and efficiently out of one space.



Center Court Lounge Deck

This year we completed the third and final phase of the Center Court Lounge Deck. This deck is the perfect place to enjoy outdoor music, food, and fun courtside under the oaks. Take in tennis and enjoy the view.

Pool and Spa Resurfacing

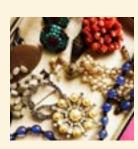
The Meadows pool and spa received important attention to preserve the integrity of the shell

structure, preventing water from permeating and deteriorating the structure. In addition, new lights, glass waterline tile, swim ladders and lap lane markings were added.

Outdoor Fitness Trail and New Equipment

Hurricane lan not only wreaked havoc on our trees throughout The Meadows, but it caused our 5/6 fitness bridge to fail. This year we built a new bridge in its place to allow passage over the Sarasota County ditch and connect to the next phase of the fitness trail.

Before the year ends, the fitness trail will be receiving three new pieces of fitness equipment.

Each year we have been replacing deteriorating outdoor exercise equipment and installing three new pieces its place. Once

installed we will have replaced nine pieces in total making working out in the great outdoors much more enjoyable.

Road, Stopbars and Crosswalk Striping

We are currently in the process of applying thermoplastic striping



This thermoplastic striping is highly reflective and helps drivers delineate lanes, especially in poor visibility conditions and at night.

Equipment

There are some items that, due to their age, can no longer be repaired and need replacing. For instance, this year three HVAC systems were replaced. These systems were upwards of 15 years

old, were no longer repairable, efficient and, in most cases barely operational. With heat indexes reaching 110 degrees last year, new efficient HVAC systems are critical for a building's structure as well as residents' comfort.

Water Buffalo

This year we had to put our water buffalo out to pasture as fixing it was cost prohibitive. We recently purchased this much needed

> piece of equipment; it is essential to making sure our landscaping receives watering on a regular basis.

Tables and ComputersAs activities increase.

so does the need to replace chairs and furnishings.

New tables were purchased for the Lakeside room where activities are held. These new tables replaced the old tables that were becoming unstable.

We also purchased some new computers to replace outdated and failing units. New leased printers were obtained for

staff at a reduced rate from
the previous program and all
staff have scanning capability
as we step up our electronic
recordkeeping efforts. In late
2023, the IT company used by
the MCA converted all Microsoft
Office functions to Microsoft
365 and migrated MCA files to a
cloud server from an outdated
onsite server resulting in greater
security, responsiveness, and
continual upgrading of Microsoft
365 programs and server
functions.

This is a snapshot of routine maintenance, repairs and capital improvements made this year. MCA continues to invest in keeping our assets and the community healthy. The MCA's Vision and Mission is what the MCA's team continually strives to achieve each year by keeping the community safe, well-maintained, in an environment in which residents can socialize and enjoy an active lifestyle.

The new year is traditionally a time when we set goals and promise to complete those projects in the coming year. Home maintenance is a never-ending project. The new year is a good time to examine your home maintenance task list.

Having a well-organized home maintenance plan is as important as an annual health checkup. You need to continually check your home exterior, plumbing, electrical, security, and cooling/heating systems. Create a monthly or seasonal schedule to keep your home in good working condition.

In Florida, fall and winter are good times to clean up landscaping while outdoor temperatures are low and plants are relatively dormant. Prune trees and shrubs. Pull weeds. Rake up leaves and pine needles. Check irrigation and outdoor lighting systems. Schedule tree trimming services before the spring growing seasons starts.

HOME | HEALTH

Make repairs to your home exterior. Seal wall cracks; touch up paint; weather-strip doors and windows; check chimneys; clean fireplace flues and dryer vents. Inspect the roof for cracked or missing shingles. Clear gutters and downspouts. Pressure wash walls, roofs, paths, and driveways. Clean windows.

Schedule a checkup for your heating and air conditioning system twice a year to keep those hard-working systems in good health. Replace air filters to decrease dust. Replace or install ultra-violet lights to guard against mold build up in air ducts. Test smoke alarms, replace backup batteries, and check the pressure level on fire extinguishers.

Protect your home against storms by upgrading to high-impact windows and doors. Guard against rodents and termites by installing outdoor bait boxes and other pest protection systems. If you have a swimming pool, sweep the debris off the bottom and walls, and clean the filter.

Please remember to submit an architectural review application for any major exterior repair or remodeling project such as roof repair, window replacements, tree removal or other landscape

changes. If you have any spare time left, don't forget to follow through on those self-improvement vows- lose weight, exercise regularly, learn a foreign language, read a book, volunteer in your community, organize your sock drawer, and other character-building pursuits.

Incidents are defined as a variety of complaints or concerns ranging from minor to more concerning activity reported by a resident. Examples of such (but not limited to) are; an alarm, animal and fishing complaints, reports of safety hazards, burglary, harassment, welfare check, dumping, solicitation or suspicious person(s).

Citations are violations
that do not respect our
documents related to
Meadows standards.
Examples of such are:
restricted vehicles, parking
violations, garbage cans not
being picked up or put out
too early, violations subject
to tow, and sign restrictions.

SUSPICOUS PERSON COMPLAINTS

- November 7 At the 4000 block of Ringwood Meadow, it was reported that an unknown male showed up at the residence door, and proceeded to the downstairs apartment. The male then ran to an awaiting car that sped off. Safety arrived in the area but did not observe anything. The resident was advised to contact the Sarasota County Sheriff's Office if they were to return.
- November 9 At the 5400 block of Chanteclaire, it was reported that a male and two females were observed at the rear of the residents' home. Safety responded and it was determined that they were employees of Truscapes Landscaping.

Safety arrived and was able to talk with the owner of the dog. The dog had exited the house without a leash and the owner apologized. The complainant did not report any injuries.

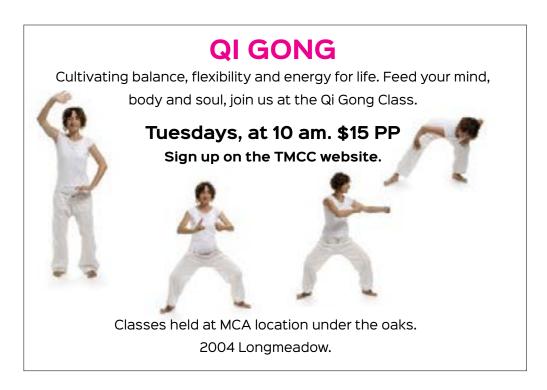

HAPPY NEW YEAR

January is the month when our thoughts focus on health, especially through our New Year's resolutions. We all make promises to eat and drink less and exercise more in an effort to be healthier and more mindful in the forthcoming year. However, in addition to personal health, single-family homeowners also have to consider health and safety in our homes and landscapes.

For our personal health, Chris Crowley and Henry S. Lodge, M.D. in Younger by Next Year suggest that we can turn back the clock if we plan our exercise as we planned our former work routines. That is easy to do in The Meadows because of the many opportunities to play golf, tennis, pickleball, and swim, bicycle, walk, run, or trek on the sidewalks, pathways, and trails. Just being outdoors in The Meadows is healthy! Additionally, the Fitness Center at the Meadows Community Lifestyle & Wellness Facility has classes, personal training consultations, and opportunities to exercise seven days a week. Lastly, the Meadows Community Association (MCA) offers many excellent courses to expand our minds and keep us healthy.

However, exercise is not the only pathway to health. Keeping a healthy home environment is another. It is also a common concern of many single-family homeowners. Therefore, January is a good month to ensure that all systems work. For example, getting the air conditioners checked and filters and air ducts cleaned are good starts to ensuring good health and breathing clean air. Other

household items to check are the batteries in the smoke detectors and filters for the driers and water in our sinks and refrigerators to determine if they need changing. Some homeowners find it helpful to have checklists of general home maintenance activities to schedule at the beginning of the year.

Health also relates to safety. Most one-story homes in The Meadows have smooth transitions from room-to-room without changing levels, which removes mobility hazards. However, other hazards can be inadvertently added such as small rugs. If you have small rugs in your houses, please consider using double-sided tape to secure the rugs and prevent accidental falls. Another safety tip is putting soft foam or rubber padding on the sharp corners of furniture, like on end tables and

nightstands. Both the double-sided tape and padding can prevent a lot of blackeyes and bruises on faces, arms, and legs.

Our yards also need some tender loving care (TLC) in January and the winter months to ensure their health year-round. Agronomists suggest that winter is a suitable time to check your irrigation systems. Additionally, the University of Florida has gardening calendars with printable suggestions for year-round gardening solutions. HOW WEATHER IMPACT OUR HEALTH

Roy Wysnewski — November Weather Analysis in The Meadows

WEATHER AND HEALTH

The weather impacts our health in different ways, leading to both positive and negative results. Living in Florida with its 'fairweather' sunshine in abundance year-round, residents receive lots of vitamin D that is so important to good health. Sunshine also lends itself to a more positive/optimistic attitude – a healthy attribute!

On the negative side, temperature plus moisture (heat) represents an increasing danger to our health, particularly during our warm summer months. With atmospheric temperatures on the rise in our area by about 0.14 degrees Fahrenheit each year since 2000, there is an increasing threat that over-exposure to sunshine will cause our body core temperatures to rise, leading to heat stress illness, including heat cramps, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke – which can be lethal! Also, breathing in increasingly hot, humid air can exacerbate respiratory conditions like asthma and COPD and strain the heart.

2023 Hurricane Season Summary

A highly unusual hurricane

NOVEMBER RAINFALL & TEMPERATURE DATA

Rainfall for month: 0.86 in.
Rainfall year-to-date: 28.10 in.
23 yr. rainfall average: 1.94 in.

Average high temperature: 82.1 F (normal: 80 F)

Above normal temperature days: 22 Record high-temperature days: 8

season concluded on November 30th. Despite a strong hurricane-shredding El Nino event in place after mid-June, and pre-season forecasts calling for a near-normal hurricane season, 20 named storms formed. This number ties 1933 for the 4th highest on record!

Seven storms were hurricanes and three – Franklin, Idalia and Lee – became major hurricanes with Franklin reaching maximum sustained winds of 150 mph! Hurricane Lee was the only Category 5 hurricane.

Only one hurricane, Idalia, had an impact on southwest Florida this season. On August 30th, it grazed the Sarasota coastline as it moved north in the Gulf of Mexico, about 150 miles offshore. Storm surge led to minor damage on the shoreline. On a positive note, the hurricane gave Meadows residents 5.5 inches of badly-needed rain.

An Affair of Spies

Joanne Simons-January Book Review

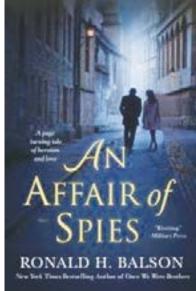
A good spy novel takes a historical event, weaves into it a fictional hero or heroine on a treacherous mission, and endeavors to convince the reader that things may not turn out the way history records. That's the plan in An Affair of Spies by Ronald H. Balson (St. Martin's Press, 2022). Enlisting the reader's willing suspension of disbelief, the novel aims to convince the reader that the Nazi's efforts to develop a nuclear weapon could well have succeeded in manufacturing such a bomb to defeat the Allies during World War II.

"Nathan Silverman grew up in Berlin in the 1920s, the son of a homemaker and a theoretical physicist. His idyllic childhood was soon marred by increasing levels of bigotry against his family and the rest of the Jewish community, and after his uncle is arrested on Kristallnacht, he leaves Germany for New York City with only his mother's wedding ring to sell for survival.

"While attending an evening course at Columbia in 1941, Nathan notices a recruitment poster on a university wall and decides to enlist in the military and help fight the Nazi

regime. To his surprise, he is quickly selected for a special assignment; he is trained as a spy, and ordered to report to the Manhattan Project. There he learns that the Allies are racing to develop a nuclear weapon before the Nazis."

Nathan is selected for this assignment because a German theoretical physicist who is thought to be critical to the Nazi's effort, and who is hoping to defect, was a friend of Nathan's father, also a physicist. Disguised as a Nazi officer, Nathan and Dr. Allison Fisher, a scientist with the Manhattan Project, are to sneak into Germany, learn as much as
