
This is just the beginning of bringing our amenities — and all the joy, connections, and vitality they bring — back to the heart of The Meadows.

NOT FILE FOR
BANKRUPTCY.

There has been a lot of misinformation going around about the finances of The Meadows. First, The Meadows is in good financial condition. The Meadows DID NOT file for bankruptcy.

It was The Meadows Country Club (TMCC) that filed for bankruptcy. The Meadows neither owned, operated nor was MCA in any way financially responsible for the country club. When Taylor Woodrow originally developed the Meadows, they owned the common areas, the club and the shopping village. Many decades ago, they sold the club to the members of the club but the name did not change. The same

is true for the shopping village.
The MCA bought the land and
buildings from the TMCC in 2019
to protect the community green
space and prevent its impending
development by Neal and Danato.

We have had clean audits every year and we have reduced, much faster than required, the debt incurred for building our Lifestyle building and completing payment for the 300+ acres of open space we purchased from the TMCC.

There have certainly been challenges this year with the club declaring bankruptcy and Herald Tribune's erroneous headline declaring that the Meadows had filed for bankruptcy. We are a creditor with claims in the

bankruptcy. We are NOT liable for any of the club's debts.
As owners of the land and building, we have had to spend unbudgeted funds for their maintenance and operation but we are managing that carefully to preserve the assets while not over running our available funds.

We will continue to report to the community on the financial status of the Meadows and the operational impacts to MCA resulting from the TMCC bankruptcy. While rumors abound making all kinds of unwarranted and demonstrably false statements, we are not in any financial trouble and don't intend to be.

SAFETY REPORT

In the month of August, 2025 there were (17) incident free days - (Same as) July 2025. There were (19) reported incidents - (4) Less than July 2025. There were (40) citations issued - (28) Less than July 2025.

Safety responded to the following during the month of August:

SUSPICIOUS INCIDENT

SUSPICIOUS PERSON

- August 5th, a man was located walking North on Longmeadow, who seemed disoriented. When confronted the man ignored Safety's questions and continued walking without answering and then suddenly turned and headed South to 17th St. SCSO was called and responded and made contact with the man on 17th St.
- August 7th, in the Weybridge community an unknown woman was reported as being in the dumpster area and when asked by complainant what she was doing the woman replied, she was cleaning the dumpster area.
 She then got into a black Mazda SUV and left the community.
- August 8th, in the 5600
 block of Piper's Waite it was
 reported a young woman
 standing for 20 to 30 minutes
 under a tree across from the
 residence and when it started
 raining walked away. The

woman was never located after a search of the area was done.

· August 11th, it was reported that the prior evening in the 3100 block of Longmeadow a man was pounding on the sliding glass doors of the residence and would not go away. Complainant states they opened the door and confronted the man by yelling at him to get away from the residence. The man finally left toward the golf course area. Complainant was advised to never confront someone in that manner and call SCSO and then Safety.

MEDICAL EMERGENCY

 August 4th, Safety was alerted by Life Alert of an incident at 3400 block of Longmeadow. Safety arrived with EMS and Fire. Resident was transported to hospital via ambulance.







RECIPE FOR PORCINI MUSHROOM SOUP

-200 gr of dried porcinis 6 oz

- 300 gr cremini mushroom 9oz sliced thin
- 2 regular size potatoes
- -1 medium onion
- fresh thyme, salt, pepper to taste
- 225 ml heavy cream 35% 1 cup
- 775 ml water (3 cups)
- 1 tbsp fresh garlic grated
- 1 tbsp truffle oil
- 3 tbsp olive oil


Start by hydrating the porcini mushrooms with the 750 MI lukewarm water for one hour, slowly roast the onions, thyme with the olive oil, peel the potatoes and cut small, mix with the onions and thyme, throw in the cremini first and garlic and ones well roasted and color darkens (20 min) strain the porcini and use the water in the soup mix, keep the porcini on the side to add once the soup is blended, after 40 min boiling add cream, bring to boil again then let the soup cool off for 10 min; blend in blender, strain(for smoother result) add the porcini(you can always cut the porcini in smaller pieces) before serving add the truffle

Adventures of Huckleberry Finn



Published in 1884, eight years after *The Adventures of Tom*Sawyer, Mark Twain's Adventures of Huckleberry Finn is a "witty, satirical tale of childhood



"What's the use you learning to do right when it's troublesome to do right and ain't no trouble to do wrong, and the wages is just the same?" rebellion against hypocritical adult authority." ¹


"Huckleberry "Huck" Finn is the son of the town's vagrant drunkard, "Pap" Finn. Sleeping on doorsteps when the weather is fair, in empty hogsheads during storms, and living off of what he gets from others, Huck lives the life of a destitute vagabond. The author metaphorically names him "the juvenile pariah of the village" and cites Huck's "idle, and lawless, and vulgar, and bad" qualities as cause for admiration from all the other children in the village, although their mothers "cordially hated and dreaded" him." 2

Huck's childhood was mostly wild and free and did not include much schooling. At the end of *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer*, Tom and Huck recover a treasure worth thousands of dollars, leading Huck to be taken in by the Widow Douglas. She enrolls him in school and begins to "sivilize" [sic] him. After Huck's father, learning of the boy's good fortune, asserts his parental

rights and takes Huck from her, Huck fakes his own death and escapes to Jackson's Island, where he meets Jim, a slave who is running away because his owner is planning to "sell him South" for eight hundred dollars. "Jim wants to escape to Cairo, Illinois, where he can find work to eventually buy his family's freedom. Huck and Jim take a raft down the Mississippi River, planning to head north on the Ohio River, in hopes of finding freedom from slavery for Jim and freedom from Pap for Huck. Their adventures together, along with Huck's solo adventures, comprise the core of the book." 3

"Samuel Langhorne Clemens (1835-1910) trained as a steamboat pilot on the Mississippi river; 'Mark Twain', a phrase used on riverboats to indicate that the water is two fathoms deep, became the pseudonym by which he was best known. After the Civil War, Twain turned to journalism, publishing his first short story in 1865.

Dubbed 'the father of American





literature' by William Faulkner, Twain led a colourful life of travelling, bankruptcy and great literary success." 4


